

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














City of Austin Partners with GivePulse for Volunteerism

Building Professionals Demur at Proposed City Lobbying Changes

In a meeting of the Ethics Review Commission on September 28th, engineers and others in the building industry voiced grave concerns over a proposal that would likely require many of them to register as lobbyists because of their regular interactions with city officials. A final draft of the changes is unlikely to mature anytime soon as the commission is posed to discuss the issue further at meetings on Oct. 13 and Oct. 27.

ACC to Implement Race and Gender Neutral Certification Program

In an effort to establish it's own vendors list, Austin Community College is implementing a new certification program for small and local businesses to participate in its new bond program totaling \$368 millions.

The program does not consider race or gender as a factor to qualify for the program under the SLBE (small and local business enterprise) certification. The ACC Board of Trustees has elected to adopt SLBE last year becoming the only public entity in central Texas that does not recognize MBE/ WBE, HUB, or DBE certifications. It is to ensure there are data to support disparity in ACC contracting especially at a time when minority groups in the country pose to take the majority seat, according to program coordinator, Jason Clark.

Austin Selected for Unique Partnership to Transform Mobility

The City of Austin, together with Rocky Mountain Institute (RMI) and the City of Denver announced their partnership recently to transform Austin and Denver's mobility future. The partnership will leverage the power of emerging technology and innovation to expand transportation options to address congestion, costs, commuting, safety, and the environment.

RMI chose Austin and Denver for this innovative project after a national search. Austin was chosen as the lead implementation city because of its strength as an education and technology center, its entrepreneurial culture, and collaborative government. Google recently picked Austin as the second city in the country for testing their autonomous vehicle.

Development and Permitting Fee Increases Become Effective October 1

Effective October 1, 2015, the Development Services Department and Planning and Zoning Department will imple-

ment fee increases for all development and permittingrelated activities in accordance with recent cost of service studies. The new fee structure for the Development ServiceDepartment will apply to all building permits, trade permits (plumbing, electrical, mechanical, and irrigation), commercial and residential, site plan, and subdivision applications. The Planning and Zoning Department's related fees will apply to zoning, historic preservation, and special districts such as Municipal Utility Districts (MUDs) and Public Improvement (PID) districts.

White Lodging to Repay Waived Fees to City

White Lodging will be repaying the city \$2.4 million in fees that were initially waived for construction of the JW Marriott downtown. The announcement in a recent council meeting came after The Workers Defense Project and other community groups took it to the council regarding the hotel conglomerate's failure to pay prevailing wages after receiving fee waiving benefits. The company will also drop its lawsuit against the city.

Public Meeting for Lamar Beach Master Plan

The Austin Parks and Recreation Department will host a Vision Workshop, the first public meeting for the Lamar Beach Master Plan, on October 14, 2015, from 6:30–8:00 p.m. at Austin High School, 1715 W. Cesar Chavez Street.

The public meeting will include the following activities: a 30minute open house starting at 6:30, and a 60-minute interactive presentation beginning at 7 p.m. The project team will lead the interactive presentation and mapping exercise to capture input from participants, including opportunities and challenges of the planning area.
